Be Aware of Scams

With tax season upon us, some residents will discover that they have fallen victim to ID Theft. If you find yourself victimized, please contact the Muskego Police Department. To help protect your ID and tax filings, you should consider assigning a five digit personal PIN to your Federal tax filings to assist the IRS in confirming your legitimate tax filings. You should also consider obtaining a separate PIN from the State of Wisconsin.
