January 18th, 2019 – January 24th, 2019

Do you want to build a snowman, Muskego? We certainly got enough snow, but no one in their right mind should be subjecting themselves to these frigid temperatures for purposes of leisure. Enough about the weather, let's have a look at this past week, shall we?

January 18th:

- 2:11 a.m. – Officers responded to a health care facility located in the W18600 block of Janesville Rd. for the report of an unruly resident. A 77 year old Milwaukee man was transported to a different medical facility.
- 9:10 a.m. – A 55 year old Waterford resident was arrested for OWI after being called in by an employee of a restaurant located in the W15600 block of Janesville Rd, where the arrest occurred.
