Who found the pot of gold, Muskego?! Anyone? Anyone? Bueller? Yeah, me neither. I did however go to a High Kings concert at the Pabst Theater and holy vocal chords, Batman! Those lads can sing! If you enjoy traditional Irish folk music, the group is coming back to Milwaukee this summer for Irish Fest. Now that St. Patrick's Day is behind us, we can focus on the next national holiday, March Madness! My west region is already destroyed thanks to Baylor's win over Syracuse last night, but who cares? Go Bucky! Before you start to jump around to House of Pain, let's look at last week's events.

March 15th:

- 1:38 a.m. – A 56 year old Muskego resident was arrested for OWI – 2nd Offense and obstructing officers (which never works). The arrest occurred near the intersection of Martin Dr. and Hardtke Dr.

*****HELP US, HELP YOU!*****

The Muskego Police Department is creating a comprehensive list/map of all businesses and residences within the city that are willing to provide us with access to their security/surveillance systems. Here's how it will work: you or your neighbor has video/audio surveillance for your house or business. There was an incident that required police presence and investigations nearby. Officers are now looking for a suspect or suspect vehicle that may have been captured by your surveillance. By filling out the appropriate form, officers are able to see that you are in close proximity to the incident and may have valuable evidence pertaining to the incident from your surveillance. Officers make contact with you and ask for your assistance in obtaining said surveillance/possible evidence. That's it! We are not infiltrating your security system, watching you do Tae Bo in your living room (if that's even a thing anymore), or violating any of your constitutional rights! We will not have access to the surveillance unless you give it to us! There are no obligations; the list simply allows investigating officers know you have it!
