April 5th:

*****CITY BURNING REGULATIONS*****

As the weather warms up (not this Sunday) and we work on making our yards green again, we need be mindful of the city's ordinance reference burning refuse. The police department has already received complaints from neighbors regarding bothersome smoke, so here are a few things to keep in mind: Since the turn of the 20th century, cities have created organized pickup of garbage. Advanced Disposal stopped by the Sartorius residence this past Wednesday, so don't burn it, and you can't use the excuse of "well I didn't know I couldn't burn that" either, because I'm going to attach a link to a list that takes less than two minutes to read. Also, don't go lighting a bon fire when it's so windy the birds are walking. This is only going to lead to us showing up and telling you to "shut 'er down like a NASCAR driver on Sunday afternoon" as it creates a nuisance to your neighbors and effects visibility when close enough to roadways. If you want to burn, make sure you're 15 feet or further from lot lines. Once you start the fire, keep an eye on it. "Well, my kids are outside" doesn't count as you must be 18 years of age or older.
