May 10th:

- 8:20 a.m. – A 44 year old resident of the W13500 block of Lloyd Mangrum Court responded to the police department to report his BMO Harris debit card was used by an unknown subject without his consent and the thief had racked up over \$300 in debt that hopefully the bank reinstates! If you receive a phone call asking for donations for the Muskego Police Department, **IT IS A SCAM!!!** The tricky part about all of this is there are programs in existence that allow you to mask your phone number with a phone number of your choosing. So, when these shady individuals call, the number on your caller ID may very well show up as our non-emergency (262) 679-4130 number. If at any point you question the validity of what the person on the other end of the line is saying or they are asking for your money, hang up, call the non-emergency number (or mine) back as it will go through to us and not the scammers. We'll be happy to set you straight. Also, we've received a few complaints from citizens receiving phone calls from "Publishers Clearing House" claiming they've won a new car! All they had to do was pay a meager \$400 shipping and processing fee. **NEWSFLASH!!!** You don't pay shipping and processing fees on items won from Publishers Clearing House. Heck, I'm not even sure they give away cars to begin with. I tried checking their website, but of course I had to sign up for a chance to win \$25,000 a month for life first. *****BOATING SAFETY*****

The weather IS getting warmer, (Friday didn't get the memo) and with warmer weather comes days in the boat out on the water. We have a few bodies of water here in Muskego, so as appropriate, I'll be sprinkling in some boater safety tips here and there in the coming newsletters. This week Officer Jones and I would like to touch on some speed restriction issues. Now, many of you are aware that you're not supposed to operate a motor boat at a speed in excess of 10 mph from sunset each day until 8 a.m. the following morning on any of our lakes. However, did you know, that unlike the WI DNR website that states "no person may operate a motor boat within 100 ft. of any dock, pier, and buoy restricted area at a speed in excess of slow-no-wake", we have extended this restriction to 150 ft.? And why is this you might ask? We're special and care about your safety a whole 50 ft. more (We love you thiiiiis big)! Also contrary to many neighboring bodies of water outside our great city, the slow-no-wake speed extends on either side of said buoy, meaning you're not allowed to gun it once you're past the marker. We understand that eyeing 150 ft. can be difficult, especially on the water, so let's put it into some perspective. Giannis is just shy of 7 ft. tall, so if you can picture approximately 21.5 Giannises on top of one another...or, 150 feet is also 50 yards, which is the equivalent of half of a football field. If you don't watch sports, maybe you like food. Spaghetti noodles average between 10-12 inches in length, so we'll say 164 spaghetti noodles will get you in the safe zone, otherwise 8.5 average size giraffes. Those are Northern Giraffes, not to be confused with the Reticulated or Kordofan Giraffes. Different giraffes give you different heights, people! (You get the picture.)
