Happy Tuesday, Muskego! I'll continue to apologize for the tardiness and mere fact that I'm weeks behind on providing you with the up and up in our city. Having that said, I hope everyone had a great 4th of July and all the fireworks weren't too bothersome. In case you missed it, Mayor Chiaverotti shook hands with the POTUS, Donald Trump, on the tarmac at General Mitchell Airport on July 12th as part of a NAFTA replacement meeting. The Manhattan Project which took place on July 16th, 1945 at 5:29 a.m. in the desert of Alamogordo, New Mexico. Now, for some Muskego history.

June 21st:

- 1:33 a.m. – Officers responded to a residence located in the W18500 block of Crest Dr. after receiving the report from a third party of two male subjects that were shot at the residence. Mutual aid was requested from New Berlin Police Department. Upon arrival, contact was made with 6 subjects who were detained, none of them shot, while the residence was cleared. Contact was attempted at the residence with negative results. A voicemail was left for the homeowner. *****SCIT NEEDS YOUR HELP!*****

SCIT, which stands for Suburban Critical Incident Team, is a multi-jurisdictional law enforcement tactical team composed of officers and EMS personnel from Brookfield, Chenequa, Delafield, Elm Grove, Hartland, Mukwonago, New Berlin, Pewaukee, and of course, Muskego! The resource serves over 140,000 citizens and they are looking to add a multi-purpose rescue vehicle to their fleet. Right now, SCIT does not possess such a vehicle and relies on the Waukesha and Milwaukee County Sheriff's Departments to utilize their multi-purpose rescue vehicles for barricaded subjects, high risk incidents, etc. which always require two such vehicles. After contacting those agencies, arrival times can take in excess of 30 minutes and then these agencies are depleted of this resource should they have such an incident occur within their own jurisdictions. It may be noted that the vehicle can also be used in the event of natural disasters, such as floods, during rescue efforts. Its armor serves as a large shield during attempts to rescue potentially injured officers and/or citizens. Contact Sgt. PFD REMINDER

PFD stands for Personal Flotation Device. It's wicked hot and the lakes are full of boats, jet skis, kayaks, paddle boards, etc. as they should be! Just remember that your PFDs must be in good working condition (basically meaning they fit and will keep you afloat), readily accessible, and match the number of souls aboard your vessel. Yes, these rules include the kayaks and paddles boards. While you don't have to be wearing them, you have to have one while out on the water and it has to be accessible. Kayaks and paddle boards usually have a spot in the front where the PFD can be secured under crisscrossed bungee ties so that if/when you fall out, all you have to do while treading water is unsecure the PFD then attempt to put it on while you're in the water? Sounds difficult enough that maybe you should just put it on before heading out OR don't tip over. We didn't make this rule, but we will be enforcing it!
