August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019 – August 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2019

Happy Friday, Muskego! It's National Pepperoni Pizza Day, National Punch Day, as well as National Queso Day. As a fellow Wisconsinite, we must do our due diligence in melting down some Velveeta, adding in some Hormel Chili and celebrate. All the while sipping on punch (or an old fashioned, I mean it contains fruit like a punch) and slicing up some pepperoni covered pies (I'm a supreme guy myself). If you want to wait until tomorrow for the Badgers vs. Wolverines game, that's fine too. I'm still behind though, so let's get started.

### August 16<sup>th</sup>:

- 2:40 a.m. – A 32 year old Racine resident was cited for operating a motor vehicle with a suspended driver's license (OAS) following a traffic stop that occurred near the intersection of Moorland Rd. and Commerce Center Pkwy.
