Where did November go? It seems like Halloween was yesterday. It doesn't help that I'm well over a month behind. It's not going to get any better any time soon though, as I have to attend training all next week in Milwaukee, so I apologize. I'll do my best. Your history lesson on this Tuesday of course revolves around Thanksgiving. Did you know, in 1789, President Washington became the first president to proclaim a Thanksgiving holiday, when, at the request of Congress, he proclaimed November 26th, a Thursday, as a day of national thanksgiving for the U.S. Constitution? However, it was not until 1863, when President Lincoln declared Thanksgiving to officially fall on the last Thursday of November, that the modern holiday was celebrated nationally. October 11th:
