### **November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2019 – November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2019**

#### **November 15<sup>th</sup>:**

- 1:14 a.m. – A 44 year old Milwaukee resident was cited for OAS and advised not to drive following a traffic stop that occurred near the intersection of Janesville Rd. and Kipling Dr.

### **November 19<sup>th</sup>:**
