### **November 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2019 – November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019**

Good morning, folks! It's day 11 of the shortest month of the year, but the longest one in our minds. For those of you lucky enough to get away and out of the snow, I'm jealous. In my opinion, Valentine's Day is a pretty feeble attempt at making this month more bearable, but since we're just a few days away, here's your reminder to get a card and something nice for the one you love or sweet on. If you're flying solo this year, the 11<sup>th</sup> of February marks National Make a Friend Day, which is really just the first step sometimes. It's also Safer Internet Day, so look out for those catfish! Meanwhile, back in November...

#### **November 22<sup>nd</sup>:**
