December 13th:

- 4:52 a.m. – A 56 year old resident of the S7900 block of Lannon Dr. called the police department to report the neighbor's dog was at it again. Officers responded and spoke with dog's owner who was advised of the ordinance and to hush her puppy.
- 7:16 a.m. – A 25 year old resident of the S6800 block of Bristlecone Ct. was arrested following the execution of a search warrant at his home. Dynamic entry was made after arrestee and mother were slow to answer the door due to instead hiding items of evidentiary value. *****TEMPORARY REGISTRATION PLATES*****

Effective March 1st, 2020, temporary registration plates made of cardboard are no longer a valid form of registration. Your cutout of the 24 pack of Keystone Light you consumed over the weekend was never valid, but if it’s possible, it’s even more invalid now because it’s made of cardboard. Since all temporary registration plates will now be made of paper, don’t put them where a regular registration plate would go, unless you want to lose it within the first 10 minutes of your journey and be pulled over for non-display.

Rather, tape your paper temp pate inside the lower corner of the rear window of your vehicle on the driver’s side. If your rear window is occupied by stuffed animals, gym stickers, and/or dashboard bobble heads, the rear passenger window on the driver’s side is the next best spot. You’ve been educated.
