December 20th, 2019 – December 26th, 2019

December 20th:

- 2:44 a.m. – A 36 year old Texan was arrested for a warrant he held through the Racine County Sheriff's Department for non-support (of what I don't know). He didn't have the \$1,500 needed for bond, so we called up some deputies, met them at the Wind Lake boat launch, and turned over custody.
- 9:00 a.m. – An extremely intoxicated 75 year old resident of the W19300 block of Hillview Dr. drove his vehicle through the back of his garage, the wall of which was resting on top of the vehicle, now located in the back yard, upon officers' arrival. The incident was called in by a neighbor who witnessed the event. The vehicle/garage owner was transported to a nearby medical facility for non-life threatening injuries. Consider yourself lucky you never made it out of the actual garage door, not the one you created.
- 1:22 p.m. – An employee of a financial institution located in the S6800 block of Moorland Rd. called the police department to report a male subject had attempted to open an account using an ID that did not belong to him. When questioned, the subject left and entered a gray Jeep Wrangler before driving northbound on Moorland Rd. Officers responded to the area, but were unable to locate the vehicle. Information from the complainant as well as video surveillance was turned over to the detective bureau. Investigation continuing.
- 4:34 p.m. – A box truck stuck in the ditch backed up traffic for a while in the area near the intersection of Crowbar Dr. and Kelsey Dr. Officers responded and made contact with the operator, a 35 year old Milwaukee resident. December 22nd:

- 1:56 p.m. – A 61 year old resident of the W14000 block of Groveway Lane called the police department to report her mailbox had been damaged sometime between 9 a.m. and when she called. Investigation continuing.
