### **May 22<sup>nd</sup>:**

- 1:05 a.m. – A 33 year old New Berlin resident was arrested for OWI – 1<sup>st</sup> Offense following a traffic stop that was conducted near the intersection of Baylane Dr. and Spinnaker Dr. Our arrestee was operating her vehicle at 48 mph in a 35 mph zone which prompted the stop.
