July 24th, 2020 – July 30th, 2020

I'll get caught back up, but in the meantime here's last week's events. Hope to see you all at Jammin' tomorrow night!

July 24th:

- 11:26 a.m. – A 72 year old resident of the W19100 block of Hillview Drive called the police department to report a bicycle had been stolen from her property. If memory serves me correct, the bike belonged to her granddaughter. An officer responded to investigate further. A check of the neighborhood was conducted, however the bike had yet to be located. Reference the post on Facebook for a photo of the bike. Investigation continuing.

- 11:08 p.m. – Yoots were yet again dispersed from the parking lot of the businesses located in the S7800 block of Racine Ave.
- 11:11 p.m. – A 19 year old Saint Francis resident was cited for speeding and possession of the giggle smoke plant at the summation of a traffic stop that was conducted near the intersection of Parkland Drive and Janesville Rd. No giggling for you!

July 25th:

- 12:46 a.m. – Officers responded to the area near the intersection of Ancient Oaks Drive and Sanctuary Drive after receiving a phone call from an 18 year old Bristol resident reference a possible domestic altercation. Officers again responded to make contact, and this time his ride was en route from Canada. Might be a while. He was encouraged to wait in a public area as opposed to private parking lots. Hopefully your ride brings you some Canada Dry, as in switch to ginger ale and dry yourself out, you're scarin' away the customers.
