August 21st:

- 8:39 a.m. – A 59 year old Milwaukee resident was cited for OAR and arrested on a misdemeanor bail jumping charge for violating the conditions of his bail by...operating a motor vehicle without a valid license. His license was initially revoked due to a previous OWI conviction. Slow learner. All this occurred following a traffic stop near the intersection of Racine Ave. and Parker Drive.
- 8:53 a.m. – A 55 year old resident of the W19900 block of Sanctuary Drive called the police department to report an unknown subject had stolen his political sign and replaced it with one from the opposite party. That's taking it to the next level. Our complainant wished to hold onto the opposing party's sign as he had been planning to purchase one only to deface it and would now save some money. Have at it.
- 9:47 a.m. – Meanwhile on Princeton Drive, our landlord called back to report her former tenant was parked in front of her residence and was concerned as he had no reason to be there since moving out the day prior. An officer responded and made contact with the now former tenant who stated he had stopped by to pick up a few things he had left at the curb due to not having enough space in his vehicle the day before. Probably not the best location to leave your personal effects.
- 10:20 a.m. – A 63 year old resident of the S8400 block of Bendingbrae Drive called the police department to report his neighbor consistently drives his truck up and down the road in excess of 50 mph. That's not safe. Officers responded to a residence located in the W19700 block of Loveland Ct. and spoke with the 19 year old operator who was advised to knock it off.
- 11:57 a.m. – A 41 year old Waukesha resident called the police department to report possessing video footage of a 36 year old Muskego resident abusing her own dog the day before. You may have seen the picture or video our complainant posted on social media. The dog owner had stopped in to complain about being taped/photographed by our complainant the date the incident occurred. Still following? Contact was made with all parties who were advised accordingly and the welfare of the dog was checked and deemed satisfactory.
- 1:23 p.m. – A 48 year old resident of the S7700 block of Freedom Avenue was given a verbal warning for riding his miniature motorized bike on the roadway. For shame! It is illegal, though.
- 2:35 p.m. – Officers responded to the parking lot of a business located in the W17800 block of Janesville Rd. for the report of a two vehicle accident that had occurred on Janesville Rd. No injuries were reported. A 27 year old Milwaukee resident was cited for following too closely on the motorcycle he didn't have a license or insurance for. Genius.
- 3:07 p.m. – Officers then responded to the parking lot of a business located in the W17000 block of Janesville Rd. for the report of a second two vehicle accident. Again, no injuries were reported. A 19 year old New Berlin resident was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a valid license. It makes you wonder. If they had valid licenses would these accidents be occurring?
- 4:38 p.m. – A 61 year old Cudahy resident was cited for OAS and taken into custody on bail jumping charges by disobeying the restriction that states he is not to operate a motor vehicle unless properly licensed. Another slow learner. He most likely would not have been pulled over had he not drawn the attention of officers by flipping them the bird as he drove past. That karma, I tell ya. Prior to being transported to WCJ, he suddenly didn't feel too well. Probably a case of jail-itus, it'll getcha every time. He was transported to an area hospital and then later the jail once he was cleared with a clean bill of health. It's a miracle!
- 5:45 p.m. – A certain volunteer firefighter forgot to turn the siren off on his personal vehicle again. The noise drew a phone call to the police department from a neighbor. By the time an officer reached the W19300 block of Woodland Place, all was quiet again.

- 10:09 p.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. paramedics responded to a residence located in the S6400 block of Glenbrook Drive for the report of a cocaine related overdose. The patient was transported to an area hospital and treated accordingly. Charges of controlled substance and paraphernalia possession against the 18 year old are being referred to the district attorney’s office for prosecution as this is not her first offense.
- 11:37 p.m. – A 22 year old New Berlin resident was arrested for OWI – 1st Offense following a traffic stop that was conducted at the intersection of Cornell Drive and Durham Place for an expired registration violation. Following a blood draw, he was transported to the police department to complete the booking process prior to being released to his daddy.

August 22nd:

- 1:28 a.m. – Two yoots were located hanging around outside a business in the W16600 block of Janesville Road and subsequently escorted back to one’s residence on North Lane with verbal warnings for their curfew violations.
- 12:34 p.m. – A 34 year old resident of the W14100 block of Restfull Lane called the police department to report none of the employees or patrons of a business located in the W17700 block of Janesville Rd. were wearing masks in accordance with the governor’s mandate that we are not enforcing along with the majority of jurisdictions in Waukesha County due to its unconstitutionality. Our complainant requested an officer respond to the business and advise the employees and patrons, so respond an officer did. Upon arrival, a sign was located in a window of the business specifically stating that the business would not be adhering to the mandate, so we notified the business manager that they would have one less customer that day, which didn’t seem to phase them in the least.
- 12:40 p.m. – A 77 year old resident of the W12700 block of Hi View Drive called the police department to report finding 6 opened disinfectant wipe containers near the wooded area on her lot. Instead of containing disinfectant wipes however, they appeared to be filled with used toilet paper. That’s disgusting. I’m not advocating for littering here, but toilet paper is biodegradable, so why someone is choosing to store their used toilet paper is a question I’m not sure I want an answer to. The finding was reported for informational purposes only at this time. Just gross.
- 2:44 p.m. – A 58 year old Arizona resident who also owns property in the S6900 block of Sherwood Circle responded to the police department to report his ex-husband had cashed their stimulus checks without having him signed them and believed this was theft. I’m guessing the checks were delivered to the Muskego address, otherwise this would need to be reported in AZ. An officer was summoned and the investigation into the legalities is continuing.

- 4:21 p.m. – While patrolling Little Muskego Lake, officers pulled over a vessel near the launch at Idle Isle. Contact was made with the operator, a 15 year old Milwaukee resident, who had not passed the boater safety class and was also listed as a missing juvenile through the West Allis Police Department. While speaking with the female subject, she became uncooperative and walked away from officers. Contact was also made with her father who was equally as unpleasant. She was issued a compliance order for the boater safety class and West Allis P.D. was notified of her whereabouts.
- 7:27 p.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. paramedics responded to a residence located in the S7300 block of Hillendale Drive for the report of a female patient in imminent labor and a low fetal heart rate for the infant. The baby was delivered on scene and once stabilized, turned over to its mother and the midwife at the residence. Volunteer paramedics just deliverin’ more babies, no big deal!

- 7:28 p.m. – A 63 year old resident of the W16400 block of Woods Rd. was cited on behalf of his two dogs that chased after two female, teenage walkers and bit them on their legs. Our victims were simply passing by when they were attacked by the animals who had gotten loose when their owner's granddaughter supposedly left a door open. This isn't the first complaint we've received reference these two dogs. The owner admitted that neither dog's rabies vaccination was up to date, nor were they licensed through the city. Great. Compliance orders were issued for the licenses along with a mandatory court appearance for the bite citations. Pet ownership requires responsibility. If you don't have the time to properly train your pets, you probably shouldn't own any.
- 8:21 p.m. – A 34 year old Milwaukee resident was cited for OAS and advised not to drive following a traffic stop that occurred near the intersection of Janesville Rd. and Park Drive.
- 9:18 p.m. – A U/I complainant called the police department to report the operator of a tan colored pickup truck was doing burnouts in the parking lot of a business located in the W18900 block of Janesville Rd. and causing a ruckus. Officers responded, located the vehicle, and made contact with its operator, an 18 year old Waukesha resident who was advised of the complaint, given a verbal warning for causing the ruckus, and issued a compliance order for his vehicle's registration status.
- 9:38 p.m. – A 16 year old Muskego resident called the police department to report accidentally striking another vehicle with hers in the W15100 block of Rosewood Drive. An officer responded to assess the damage. Status pending.
- 9:40 p.m. – A U/I complainant called the police department to report observing between 10 and 12 yoots climbing on the roof of the pavilion at Lions Park and attempting to enter the locked bathrooms. Officers responded and located the group who was advised reference park hours and the dangers associated with climbing on things not meant to be climbed on. They were escorted to a residence located on Oak Grove Drive and released to an adult on scene who I'm sure was thrilled.

August 23rd:

Phone calls were made to parents who requested both boys be dropped off at a residence in the S7600 block of Racine Ave. It's 2:30 in the morning...you should know where your children are.
- 3:26 a.m. – An officer pulled over a vehicle full of subjects from Milwaukee near the intersection of Racine Ave. and College Ave., due to the registered owner and operator of the vehicle not possessing a valid driver's license. No one else in the vehicle did either for that matter, so after the operator was issued his citation, they were all transported back to the police department where they awaited rides from subjects with valid D.L.'s. "Hey! None of us have driver's licenses, so let's get in the car and head to the suburbs and cruise around aimlessly at 3 in the morning when there aren't as many vehicles on the road so we have a better likelihood of being noticed and getting pulled over!" I've grown quite fond of the phrase "play stupid games, win stupid prizes". I honestly don't know what their intentions were by driving to Muskego. Regardless, no one in the vehicle obviously thought those plans through.
- 6:20 a.m. – A controlled burn on HOA property garnered a phone call to the police department by a U/I complainant concerned by the flames and smoke. Officers responded and verified it was being properly overseen.
- 10:19 a.m. – A 61 year old New Berlin resident forgot to pay for his \$20.00 worth of gas at a business located in the W15400 block of Janesville Rd. An employee called the police department to report the oversight. Contact was made with the forgetful subject who later returned to the business and paid for said fuel.

- 10:26 a.m. – A 41 year old resident of the W20700 block of S. Denoon Rd. called the police department to report observing a vehicle parked in her driveway, but not knowing who it belonged to. An officer responded and was able to locate the vehicle operator, a 17 year old Pewaukee resident, who was advised to move the vehicle and did. “They don’t look like they’re going anywhere, I’ll just park my car in this random person’s driveway because it’s convenient for me.”
- 11:29 a.m. – A 48 year old Muskego resident called the police department to report observing two brown and white cows meandering in the roadway on Henneberry Drive near the intersection of Racine Ave. An officer responded, however was unsuccessful in locating the two bovines who must have moooved along. Hey, I’m a dad now so I can make corny dad jokes.

No entry to his residence appeared to have been made and all his possessions were accounted for. The incident was reported for informational purposes only at this time.
- 5:07 p.m. – An officer stopped out with a 20 year old Wind Lake resident and his sport bike in the parking lot of a business located in the W16300 block of Janesville Rd. due to them resembling that of the officer’s suspects from a pursuit the previous week. The subject claimed he had just purchased the bike earlier that day, although did not have any proof and stated the clutch on the bike had just gone out which is why he had pulled into the parking lot. Well, either way, he did not possess a Class M license, so he was cited for the violation and his bike was towed.
- 8:04 p.m. – A 22 year old Milwaukee resident was cited for OAS, advised not to drive, and given a verbal warning for the equipment violation that originally got him pulled over near the intersection of Janesville Rd. and Poes Place.
- 9:12 p.m. – A 46 year old Stallis resident was arrested on 5th Offense OWI charges, obstructing, eluding, and reckless driving among other things after leading officers from multiple jurisdictions on a wild goose chase through the burbs. Our officers first attempted pulling him over after he was seen driving eastbound on Janesville Rd. at a rate of 54 mph in a 35 mph zone. OWI suspicions began when he drove over a pile of boulders on a frontage road in Hales Corners. A pursuit ensued and ended with a Greenfield Police Department Officer pitting the silver, Toyota Tacoma near the intersection of W. Beloit Rd. and S. 73rd St. The operator then fled on foot, but didn’t get too far before being decentralized on the ground by multiple officers and taken into custody. “...somebody got away, somebody didn’t get to far, yeah. They didn’t get too far.” His vehicle was towed and he enjoyed an overnight stay at WCJ after having his blood drawn.
- 11:14 p.m. – A 52 year old resident of the S6400 block of Jewel Crest Drive responded to the police department to report being kicked in the face by his wife during a domestic altercation. Once the complainant’s side of the story was gathered, contact was made with the wife who painted a different picture of the incident involving a gun. Both parties agreed to remain separated and the case has been referred to the district attorney’s office.

August 24th:

- 5:39 a.m. – A 39 year old Milwaukee resident was cited for OAS, no insurance, given a verbal warning for a registration violation, and advised not to drive following a traffic stop that occurred in the S9200 block of North Cape Road.
- 12:22 p.m. – A 17 year old Waterford resident responded to the police department to report her vehicle was struck from behind by a silver, Dodge pickup truck while stopped at the intersection of Racine Ave. and Woods Rd. She was advised of the proper use of 9-1-1 and provided the non-emergency number as well as the office line for D.P.W., although I'm not sure they'll be able to help either.
- 2:51 p.m. – A 32 year old Oak Creek resident was cited for following too closely, however I'd argue the sand hill cranes were the ones to blame. Officers responded to the intersection of Durham Drive and Schultz Lane for the report of a three vehicle accident. The first driver stopped to let the cranes safely cross the road. The second driver stopped behind the first, and the third driver tried to stop, but was unsuccessful in doing so, crashing into vehicle #2 and causing vehicle #2 to bump into vehicle #1. - 8:08 p.m. – A 43 year old South Milwaukee resident was taken into custody for three valid warrants he held through the City of Cudahy Police Department for speeding, an un-registered vehicle, and no insurance. He was able to pay the \$346.80 bond amount in full, of course now he has to pay for the citation we issued him since he still doesn't have insurance. The price of ignorance.
- 9:12 p.m. – A 52 year old resident of the W21000 block of Fireside Drive called the police department to report multiple attempted acts of fraud via the internet and mail. Our complainant was not out any money, however an officer responded to investigate none the less.
- 9:59 p.m. – A 20 year old Union Grove resident was pulled over for an equipment violation near Woods Rd. and Parkland Drive. The traffic stop lead to an OWI investigation that ended with the subject being taken into custody for underage alcohol consumption and operation of a motor vehicle, possession of drug paraphernalia, underage possession of open intoxicants, and to top it all off, he was cited for no insurance. We gave him a verbal warning for the equipment violation. Congrats!
- 11:14 p.m. – Although it's not our jurisdiction, officers were requested to assist New Berlin P.D. with a possible burglary in progress at a business located on the north side of College Ave. just east of Racine Ave. The owner of the business called 9-1-1 after watching the suspects break a window, enter the business, and steal a display case filled with vape pens. The suspect was described as wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt, black pants, and a mask. They were last seen entering a newer, white, 4 door sedan with black rims, dual exhaust pipes with chrome tips, a moon roof, LED headlights, and no registration plates. Unfortunately, the suspect and vehicle were GOA.

August 25th:

- 8:12 a.m. – A 64 year old resident of the W13400 block of Hale Park Ct. called the police department to report joining the "someone stole my political sign" club. Welcome.
- 11:18 a.m. – A 79 year old resident of the W14500 block of Easy Street responded to the police department to report receiving messages from a subject claiming to be her nephew. Our complainant indicated offering to send her "nephew" money to ease the troubles he was having, however he informed her that his wallet and ID had been stolen, but was still in possession of his phone and computer which our complainant found suspicious. In deed. An officer was summoned and the complainant was advised to proceed with caution. If it was me, I wouldn't send that money.
- 11:20 a.m. – A 29 year old resident of the W14800 block of Cornell Circle called the police department to report three political/police related signs were stolen from his yard. The club grows.

- 12:26 p.m. – A 36 year old resident of the W16700 block of Spinnaker Dr. called the police department to report his 10 year old daughter had been staying with his ex-girlfriend who has no biological ties to the child and was now refusing to relinquish custody. The ex also called the police department to report being in contact with Child Protective Services and stated they were advising her not to release the child to her father. Four hours later, a social worker contacted the police department and advised that the child would be staying with the ex. Alllllrighty then.
- 12:40 p.m. – A 49 year old resident of the S6400 block of Sherwood Ct. called the police department to report a small amount of cash and a charging cord for her phone were missing from her vehicle that had been left unlocked in her driveway overnight. Due to not being home at the time of the call, she was advised to call back when home if she wished to file a theft report.
- 1:03 p.m. – An employee of a business located in the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. notified an officer already on scene of a recent theft. - 4:47 p.m. – A 39 year old resident of the S10800 block of Racine Ave. responded to the police department to report receiving threatening text messages from an unknown suspect. An officer was summoned and determined no threatening texts had been received. Our complainant then requested to be arrested and refused to leave the lobby until obliged. Investigation revealed he was in fact in violation of his bail restrictions as he had consumed alcohol prior to his arrival. Wish granted! - 11:03 a.m. – A 40 year old Cudahy resident was cited for her vehicle's expired registration status that needed renewal as of April. Yes, the DMV is backed up, but this is one of many services offered online. The stop occurred near the intersection of Woods Rd. and Mystic Drive.

- 12:26 p.m. – A passerby called the police department to report an older woman was taking photographs of political signs located in the front yard of a residence located in the S8700 block of Racine Ave. and felt this was suspicious. Offices responded, however no one was located. Contact was made with the homeowner who was advised of the activity. I'm pretty sure their signs were later vandalized, so keep reporting and record license plates of vehicles when possible, pretty please!
- 1:39 p.m. – A 58 year old resident of the W17600 block of Muskego Drive called the police department to report an unknown subject had opened a Go Bank account using her personal/private information and had so far charged nearly \$1,500.00 to the account. She was completely unaware of the account's existence until she began receiving collection letters for past due payments. That's unfortunate. A detective was summoned. Investigation continuing.
- 2:20 p.m. – A state department of health services employee called the police department to report while being on the phone with an 80 year old resident of the W12500 block of Larkspur Lane, she could hear another subject yelling and swearing at the caller. Eventually the other subject seemingly took the phone away from the caller and hung up. Officers responded to the residence and made contact with the 80 year old and his 57 year old son who still lives with his parents. Both parties admitted to having a verbal argument and nothing more. They were advised of their behavior and agreed to calm down.
- 2:24 p.m. – A 73 year old resident of the W18200 block of Lions Park Drive called the police department to report joining the "someone stole my political sign" club.
- 7:27 p.m. – Same complaint, different location. This time a 52 year old resident of the W16600 block of Hedgewood Drive was victimized.
- 7:51 p.m. – A couple residing in the S7800 block of Sanctuary Ct. responded to the police department to report an unknown subject had gotten a hold of one of their checks and attempted cashing it. An officer was summoned and investigation revealed the transaction was voided and our complainants had luckily not lost any money. They were provided a pamphlet containing information on how to best re-secure their personal information.

August 27th:

- 12:33 a.m. – A 22 year old Milwaukee resident was cited for OAS, no insurance, non-registration, and displaying false registration following a traffic stop that occurred in the parking lot of a closed establishment located in the W18700 block of Apollo Drive. The operator quickly turned onto Apollo Drive and subsequently into the parking lot after realizing officers had taken notice of the lack of registration plates on his vehicle. Officers watched as he drove through the grass, past some volleyball courts, around a light pole, and finally the dumpsters before circling back around the business to where he had entered.
