## ***CITY OF MUSKEGO POLICE BEAT NEWSLETTER***

### **September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020 – September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020**

It's Monday Muskego, but at least it's a beautiful one! I guess summer is over, because everything pumpkin spice is back with the ferocity of Hulk Hogan holding a machine gun hanging out the door of an Apache helicopter. This is a real bummer brother, because the main thing keeping us all sane during this pandemic was our ability to spend as much time outdoors as possible. It's still not unbearably cold, but it's definitely getting cooler. My college roommate, Chris, would tell me to quit being a Nancy (no offense to all the Nancys out there), put on a pair of cargo shorts and flip flops, be a man and quit crying about it because fall is the best season there is. It has its qualities, I'm just not ready to give up summer quite yet. Having that said, here's the past week's events.

#### **September 11<sup>th</sup>:**

- 8:49 a.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. paramedics responded just north of the intersection at Racine Ave. and Janesville Rd. for the report of a two vehicle accident. You're better off waiting for the stopped traffic waiting to travel south to move versus trying to cut across into the strip mall parking lot and hoping no one is coming on the outside/right turn only lane. Hindsight is 20/20. The at-fault driver was the only occupant transported to an area hospital for non-life threatening injuries. She was cited for failing to yield the right of way. A tow responded to remove both vehicles. A crash report was completed.
- 11:36 a.m. – A 28 year old resident of the S9400 block of Racine Ave. was cited for OAR, advised not to drive, and given a verbal warning for the speeding violation that first drew the issuing officer's attention to his vehicle. The stop occurred near the intersection of Woods Rd. and Baylane Place.
- 12:23 p.m. - A 43 year old resident of the S7700 block of Freedom Ave. called the police department to report observing a vehicle that was parked near his residence and running, but unoccupied. 30 minutes elapsed prior to the complainant calling and he was concerned for the operator's welfare as well as the security of the vehicle. An officer responded, however was unsuccessful in locating the operator, so a voicemail was left for the registered owner. Not smart.
- 2:51 p.m. – A deceased thunder chicken was creating enough of a traffic hazard that a passerby called the police department to report the obstruction. An officer responded just south of Henneberry Dr. on Racine Ave. and located the bird causing southbound traffic to slow down and swerve. Once moved to the side of the road, traffic was able to return to a normal flow.
- 3:28 p.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. responded to a residence located in the S6300 block of Berger Lane for the report of a fish tank lid that caught fire. I'm guessing it was illuminated. All occupants, including the family cat, were evacuated. Once on scene, firefighters secured the residence. Just need some rye bread, coleslaw, and potato pancakes. I'm sorry, my condolences to the family for the loss of their pets.
- 4:23 p.m. – A passerby called the police department to report two male subjects smoking "something" under the pavilion at Park Arthur and believed it to be suspicious. An officer responded and located two brothers formerly of Muskego, ages 21 and 19, smoking alright. The "something" was the reefer. Both were arrested and cited for possession of the controlled substance and associated paraphernalia. Older bro had decided upon arrival to pull into a handicap stall since the park was otherwise empty, so he received 3 citations instead of 2. Who says smoking weed doesn't kill brain cells?
- 9:58 p.m. – A 28 year old Milwaukee resident was pulled over near the intersection of Racine Ave. and Tans Drive for an OAS violation. Further investigation revealed he was in violation of his bail restrictions. His passenger, a 28 year old Stallis resident held three active warrants through the Delafield Police Department, however due to the 'rona was released on scene, no bond posted, per Delafield's request. The operator was cited for the OAS violation and transported to WCJ for the evening. Passenger's license was suspended as well, so there the vehicle sat.

### **September 12<sup>th</sup>:**

- 12:09 a.m. – A U/I complainant called the police department to report the music coming from an establishment in the W18200 block of Martin Drive was a little too loud for their liking. An officer responded, made contact with staff, and the volume was lowered.
- 11:33 a.m. – A 23 year old Waterford resident was cited for operating a motor vehicle hazardingly after officers responded to the intersection of STH 36 and US 45 for a two vehicle accident. Damage was minimal and no injuries were reported.
- 1:49 p.m. – A 21 year old Wind Lake resident responded to the police department to report the soccer fields at Moorland Skate Park had been damaged overnight. I'm guessing someone drove on them. An officer responded to assess and photograph the damage. D.P.W. was notified and the investigation is continuing.
- 2:07 p.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. & Rescue responded to the intersection of College Ave. and Moorland Rd. for the report of a multi-vehicular accident with air bag deployment. New Berlin P.D. also responded and the accident was deemed to have occurred in their jurisdiction. As such, the investigation was turned over to them.
- 4:56 p.m. – A 39 year old resident of the W18400 block of Lions Park Drive called the police department to report finding her child's bike, that she had reported as stolen some months ago, inside of her neighbor's garage. An officer responded and made contact with the complainant as well as the neighbor who claimed to have found the bike leaning up against the apartment complex dumpsters and assumed it was garbage as the chain derailer was broken. The bike was returned to our complainant who was advised to lecture her children on picking up after themselves and closing her garage door to prevent future "theft".
- 6:56 p.m. – A 51 year old resident of the S8300 block of Kurtze Lane called the police department to report breaking a statue outside of her ex-wife's residence earlier in the evening. To the best of my knowledge, ex-wife had not called us to report the incident, so thanks for keeping us informed. She also requested officers advise a 52 year old resident of the W18500 block of Jean Drive to stop calling her, so we did. Somehow these incidents are related, but I'm not sure how.
- 6:58 p.m. – A 52 year old resident of the W15500 block of College Ave. called the police department to report the six dogs belonging to his easterly neighbor had been barking incessantly and causing a ruckus on an otherwise peaceful evening. An officer responded and made contact with the dog owner who agreed to bring them inside. Problem solved.

### **September 13<sup>th</sup>:**

- 11:06 a.m. – A 34 year old resident of the W18800 block of Gold Drive called the police department to report an unknown vehicle had been parked in her driveway for the past hour. An officer responded to run the vehicle's registration plate and wouldn't you know it, it belonged to a friend of our complainant. The log entry doesn't say why it was parked there, but they apparently weren't visiting our complainant.
- 11:32 a.m. – A U/I complainant called the police department to report while walking past a business located in the W17300 block of Janesville Rd., a wooden sign with nails sticking out of it was blown over by the wind and struck her daughter in the foot. Luckily, no puncture wounds. The caller declined medical assistance for her daughter, however requested the sign be removed and the business notified. An officer responded and made contact with an employee who agreed to take the sign in and out of the wind.
- 7:04 p.m. – A 37 year old resident of the W15000 block of Keeley Ct. called the police department to report a black colored utility van had been driving around the neighborhood for quite some time and felt the behavior was suspicious. An officer responded to the area and ended up conducting a traffic stop on a vehicle matching the description for a speeding violation. The operator indicated attempting to make a delivery in the area, but otherwise being lost. Due to a language barrier, officers were unable to determine if the subject was one in the same as the suspicious vehicle operator.
- 9:36 p.m. – A 44 year old Muskego resident called the police department to report a reckless driver that was supposedly stopping in traffic, turning around, and had run a red light. An officer responded and pulled the vehicle over near the intersection of Woods Rd. and Edgewater Ct. The 71 year old operator admitted to being lost and slightly confused. She was escorted to the police department where her husband later responded and picked her up.

## **September 14<sup>th</sup>:**

- 1:39 a.m. – An officer stopped out with an occupied vehicle in the W14300 block of Janesville Rd. The 43 year old “driver” with a last known address listing to Milwaukee informed the officer that she was sleeping in the car with her friend due to her inability to return home as the result of an argument she was having with her mother. Well, I’d argue that you shouldn’t be living with your mother at the age of 43 anyway, but you do you.
- 2:07 a.m. – An employee of a vehicle repossession company called the police department to report he would be repossessing a maroon Kia Sorento from a residence located in the W17900 block of Scenic Drive. Apparently, the previous owner was already aware.
- 10:31 a.m. – A U/I subject responded to the police department with a small, brown and black colored dog wearing a harness and a T-shirt after finding it near the intersection of Pioneer Drive and Janesville Rd. Investigation revealed Scrappy Doo belonged to a resident in the S7600 block of Pioneer Drive who was contacted and advised to come pick up his mystery solving pooch. - 11:45 a.m. – Multiple phone calls were received to report a female subject sitting inside her vehicle in the parking lot of a business located in the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. yelling at patrons as they walked past and otherwise causing a disturbance. Prior to officers’ arrival, an employee of the business called the police department to report the same subject was now inside the store harassing patrons and refusing to leave. Contact was made with the subject, a 58 year old with a last known address listing to Cedar Grove; the same subject officers stopped out with the night before in the same business parking lot who claimed her vehicle was disabled. I’m guessing she slept in her car overnight too. Our presence alone seemed to get her to move it along, although not quietly. She was advised not to return, but she will...
- 12:01 p.m. – While dealing with Miss Yells A Lot, employees advised officers of a separate retail theft that had occurred at the business earlier in the day. Information regarding a possibly stolen vacuum cleaner was collected. A 45 year old Milwaukee resident is the primary suspect at this time as she is the registered owner of the suspect vehicle. Investigation continuing.
- 12:31 p.m. – A 62 year old Muskego resident responded to the police department to report wire transferring over \$41K to someone pretending to be someone else for an RV that did not exist. Ouch. Our victim believed he was getting a great deal on a 2016 Nexus Phantom being sold by a Brigadier General Joane K. Matthews of the U.S. Medicine Deputy Court Chief. That department does not exist, however Joane Matthews does. She is currently serving as the Deputy Adjutant General for the WI National Guard, she’s just not in the business of selling used RVs, and they are aware that her name is being used in this scam. After sending the money to an account associated with “Coin Base Incorporated” in San Francisco, CA, our victim wanted to see his purchase in person which he now realizes he should have done prior to sending the money. The RV was supposedly being held by a “MRO Transport” company based in Bellevue, WI, but when he called to set up an appointment to see his purchase, he was informed by an employee that this would not be possible without the seller present. So, he drove the two hours up to Bellevue, but ended up finding a good old fashioned Wisconsin Dairy Farm where MRO Transport was supposed to be. The farm didn’t have any RVs for sale either. Needless to say, our complainant is extremely lucky as the “Coin Base Inc.” account had already been flagged for fraudulent activity, so the transfer was never fully completed. Come to find out, his wife didn’t want him to buy an RV in the first place, so she’s pretty happy too.
- 1:21 p.m. – Employees over at City Hall called the police department to report an older male subject was standing at the service window demanding to speak with a police officer and otherwise getting unnecessarily upset. You walked into the wrong building, sir. Now, please calm down. Turns out he was supposed to be in Waterford for court and stopped at the wrong department. Sometimes it helps to read the words on your paperwork.
- 1:41 p.m. – A 59 year old resident of the S9100 block of Boxhorn Drive responded to the police department to report multiple packages had either been stolen or gone missing from his residence in the past few weeks. An officer was summoned and the investigation in continuing.
- 1:51 p.m. – Officers responded to the intersection of Racine Ave. and Janesville Rd. for the report of a two vehicle accident. No injuries were reported. A crash report was completed and a 17 year old Muskego resident was cited for following too closely. That makes two accidents in as many months plus a verbal warning for a speeding violation. I wouldn’t give him a third car, but that’s just me.

- 2:08 p.m. – Back to the business located in the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. where Miss Yells A Lot was now harassing patrons from a nearby side street. It's almost like she's playing the game of "I'm not touching you". Officers responded and told her to knock it off again. Unfortunately, due to mechanical issues with her car, this will not be the last time we hear from her in this newsletter.
- 7:21 p.m. – A 67 year old resident of the S9500 block of Racine Ave. called the police department to report a lone goose had been wandering around his property for over a week's time and was worried for its well-being. An officer responded to assess, however wouldn't you know it, the goose had left the area. It's a little late to be laying eggs, so unless there's water nearby, I don't have an answer for you.
- 7:54 p.m. – A 52 year old resident of the W17400 block of Rossmar Drive responded to the police department to report being involved in a physical altercation with her husband in their home. An officer was summoned to gather further details. Investigation continuing.
- 8:53 p.m. – A 26 year old Waukesha resident was arrested for OWI – 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense after being pulled over near the intersection of Schultz Lane and Durham Drive after doing 58 mph in a 35 mph zone. After a quick blood draw, it was off to WCJ to dry out for a while when she couldn't find a responsible party to come pick her up. Aw, too bad.

### **September 15<sup>th</sup>:**

- 7:00 a.m. – Back to the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. where Miss Yells A Lot was now reportedly flagging down motorists and asking them for cigarettes and anything else they were willing to give her. According to the most recent caller, she had urinated outside of her blue minivan as area businesses were not allowing her inside to use their restrooms, which will happen when you harass one too many of their patrons. Officers responded, again, and she was advised reference her behavior, again. There was no evidence of her urinating in public and as of now her vehicle is unfortunately and legally parked.
- 7:01 a.m. – A 46 year old resident of the W14100 block of Settler Way called the police department seeking assistance in finding the PIN for his cell phone service account. Apparently the soon-to-be ex-wife would not hand it over until he paid her \$200 and he was attempting to obtain his own line. Prior to an officer making contact with wife, our complainant called back to state he now had the PIN and no further assistance was needed. Well, we couldn't have made her give it to you anyway, but we're happy if you're happy.
- 9:34 a.m. – A 76 year old resident of the W16200 block of College Ave. called the police department to report receiving a phone call from an unknown subject advising her that an Apple iPhone had been purchased via an Amazon account she does not have and all she had to do was call Amazon via the phone number the subject provided and give some random person her personal information to get the matter sorted out. Yeah, no. Our complainant further indicated not even owning a smart phone or computer. No personal information or money was lost and she was advised of the scam.
- 10:16 a.m. – Officers stopped out with a 47 year old patron of a business located in the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. who believed his car had been backed in to while parked in the business's parking lot. The striking vehicle had not been observed and was not on scene. Our complainant was not entirely sure the damage had even occurred there. Investigation continuing while we try to find some surveillance footage.
- 11:40 a.m. – An 88 year old resident of the W14900 block of Dartmouth Circle called the police department to report receiving a phone call from an unknown subject indicating "her SSN had been compromised, so please provide me with your SSN". She did not and after speaking with an officer it was determined that no other personal information had been compromised as a result of the attempted scam. Good deal.
- 4:40 p.m. – A 42 year old Milwaukee resident was taken into custody on an active warrant he held through the City of Waukesha Police Department after being pulled over near the intersection of Racine Ave. and College Ave. A Nice person from Wind Lake called the police department and posted his bond amount in full, so after he was cited for OAS and advised not to drive, he was released on scene.

- 10:12 p.m. – A 36 year old resident of the S8200 block of Kurtze Lane responded to the police department to report feeling unsafe in her own home after having an argument with her husband who took her cell phone away at the conclusion of the altercation. An officer was summoned and determined probable cause did not exist for any legal action to be taken against the husband. Our complainant was advised to separate herself from the other party as much as possible for the remainder of the evening or until cooler heads prevailed.

#### **September 16<sup>th</sup>:**

- 2:11 a.m. – A 47 year old resident of the W17400 block of Rossmar Drive and suspect of a domestic related disorderly conduct investigation from the 14<sup>th</sup> was seen on a Ring Doorbell camera by his wife, seemingly attempting to break into his own home. Officers had attempted taking the suspect into custody earlier in the day on the 15<sup>th</sup> for the offense along with threats he made to others, however after refusing to respond to the police department, he then traveled to his brother's home in Franklin to hide out. Brother refused to open the door for Franklin officers when they attempted making contact, so the next plan was to wait for him at work, but he ended up walking into our front lobby 5 hours later to turn himself in. Smart.
- 5:54 a.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. paramedics responded to a residence located in the S7600 block of Racine Ave. for the report of a drug related medical emergency for which Narcan was successfully administered. The patient was subsequently transported to an area hospital for further treatment and evaluation.
- 7:29 a.m. – A 17 year old Muskego resident was cited for inattentive driving after running into the rear bumper of a vehicle belonging to a 55 year old resident of the S6900 block of Hale Park Drive. The fender bender took place near the intersection of Woods Rd. and Baylane Drive when our victim and complainant stopped for a school bus. The complainant indicated being tailgated by the offender prior to the accident. The damage however was minimal and no accident report was completed.
- 7:56 a.m. – A passerby called the police department to report two subjects seemingly sleeping in the doorway of a place of worship located in the W14300 block of Janesville Rd. and was concerned for their welfare. An officer responded and made contact with two residents (separate houses) of the W13700 block of Hardwicke Place, ages 34 and 29. The 29 year old was still drunk, the 34 year old not as much. The 29 year old informed officers he had recently moved to Waterford, which is a welcomed change of address. Both were cited for trespassing (God is just) before they walked to a nearby filling station to presumably purchase some non-alcoholic beverages in remedy of the hangovers prior to heading back to Hardwicke Place.
- 9:17 a.m. – A 67 year old resident of the S8100 block of Northview Drive responded to the police department to report a possible theft via fraud by contractor. A detective was summoned, investigation continuing.

Officers responded to the area surrounding the victim's residence, located the vehicle, and pulled it over near the intersection of Tess Corners Drive and Woods Rd. The two subjects inside the vehicle with our victim were removed along with all of their belongings as they were seemingly living inside of it. One of the occupants, a 25 year Milwaukee resident, was taken into custody for a retail theft warrant he held through the Oak Creek Police Department. After signing a personal recognizance bond, he was released and transported along with the other occupant, a 25 year old Milwaukee resident, to the park and ride in Hales Corners. Buh bye.
- 3:43 p.m. – A 53 year old resident of the S7400 block of Durham Drive responded to the police department to report his phone had been stolen while at a business located in the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. 3 days prior. An officer was summoned, investigation continuing.

That's a package no one wants. An officer responded to the scene of the crash. UPS indicated conducting an investigation of their own. Ours is continuing.
- 9:31 p.m. – A resident of the W15100 block of Woods Rd. called the police department to report upon returning home from a bike ride, he discovered his mail box had been damaged. He did not wish to pursue the matter however, so it was reported for informational purposes only.
- 9:53 p.m. – A 15 year old Muskego resident and one of the hoodlums rummaging through cars on Jean Drive a couple weeks back responded to the police department per officers' request. His mother called the police department to identify him after watching him in the video I posted on Facebook. He was taken into custody, processed, and released.
- 9:55 p.m. – A 21 year old Milwaukee resident was taken into custody for an active warrant she held through the County Sheriff's Department after being pulled over near the intersection of Cornell Circle and Penn Lane for an OAR violation. Due to the 'rona, the warrant was not executed, so she was released on scene after receiving her citations for OAR, failure to install an IID, and advised not to drive.

- 8:40 a.m. – A 63 year Waterford resident was cited for OAS and taken into custody for violating the conditions of his bail after being pulled over near the intersection of STH 36 and Muskego Dam Drive. His vehicle was secured and left on scene prior to his transport to WCJ.
- 9:00 a.m. – A 47 year old Hales Corners resident is under investigation for fraud after falsifying information on her application to the Muskego Norway School District. A detective was summoned, investigation continuing.
- 11:09 a.m. – Back to the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. for Miss Yells A Lot who was now making obscene and sexual hand gestures/advances towards contractors of a nearby construction crew. Yeah, that's disgusting. Officers responded and told her to knock it off. Our complainant was advised to have the contractors call the police department to make formal complaints themselves. I don't believe any were received. She's getting really close to being arrested for disorderly conduct.
- 11:39 a.m. – 30 minutes later...the manager of a different nearby business called the police department requesting she be removed from the business as she was continually walking the aisles, talking to herself, and otherwise being disruptive. Officers responded and advised her she was no longer welcome and would be cited for trespassing should she return.
- 11:40 a.m. – A 71 year old resident of the S8200 block of Kurtze Lane responded to the police department to report receiving a letter from an investment company of which she was not a client, indicating her personal information had been compromised. Let me guess, they wanted you to send them your personal information to confirm the ID theft. She didn't do it, no financial loss was incurred, and she was advised to toss the letter.

It was later determined that a secondary incident had occurred on the 15<sup>th</sup> as well. Our arrestee was transported to the police department and booked on the battery charges in conjunction with bail jumping. Once photographed and fingerprinted, he too was transported to WCJ.
