October 8th, 2021 – October 12th, 2021

Good afternoon, Muskego! I hope you're all staying dry on this lovely fall day. As I mentioned in the last edition, I'm on a shortened work week due to my sister getting hitched this Friday. I'll be headed up to Kohler tomorrow and I'm officiating the wedding, my first, so wish me luck! I'll include the remainder of this week's events in next week's edition, but we've got plenty to cover below, so let's get started.

October 8th:

- 8:03 a.m. – A 62 year old resident of the S6700 block of Woodland Place was cited after his dog bit our caller in the hand and back of the leg. The 58 year old resident of Brookside Dr. was out for a stroll when the assault occurred. An officer responded to issue the citations, one for the bite, another for the dog owner's failure to properly license his ferocious pooch.
- 11:51 a.m. – An 80 year old resident of the W19900 block of Tomar Lane responded to the police department to report an IPass belonging to a local car dealership had been stolen from his vehicle. According to our complainant, the device, also known as one of the biggest crocks of horse manure of all time, was taken sometime between the afternoon of the 6th and the morning of the 7th. Our complainant had already notified the car dealership who cancelled the IPass only for the complainant to come back to the department the following day and report finding it in a different vehicle.

- 4:24 p.m. – A 64 year old Muskego resident called the police department to report being involved in a road rage incident that occurred near the intersection of Janesville Rd. and Lannon Dr. that resulted in her vehicle being spit on by what was later discovered to be a 45 year old Burlington resident. Classless, but it takes two to tango. Phone contact was made with our suspect driver who was advised to chill out and keep his saliva in his mouth if he did in fact discharge bodily fluids. October 9th:

Check for and locate him we did. Our suspect was taken into custody, transported to our department, and eventually picked up by Greenfield officers. You can run, but you can't hide.
- 2:04 p.m. – A 34 year old Tosa resident called the police department to report her wallet was stolen from her vehicle while it had been parked in the lot of a business located in the W16000 block of Janesville Rd. The thief had already started charging her credit cards by the time she got home and realized her wallet was missing. Credit cards were cancelled and she responded back to the police department to meet with an officer. Investigation continuing.
- 2:14 p.m. – Norway P.D. called and requested we stop out a residence located in the W12500 block of Somerset Dr. and attempt to make contact with a 32 year old male subject who apparently forgot to pay for his gasoline at a station in the Town of. - 11:03 p.m. – Officers responded to a residence located in the S6600 block of Jewel Crest Dr. due to the 21 year old resident calling the police department and reporting that the rear door had been kicked in and the stove burners were turned on.
