Good afternoon, Muskego! Fall is upon us, although I think everyone started in on the pumpkin spice by the end of August, so who says you have to wait for cooler weather? I was in Oshkosh last week, Wednesday through Friday for an annual crime prevention conference, which is why I'm late on releasing the newsletter. It's a great conference and as always, I was able to bring a few things/ideas back with me. Having that said, I appreciate the patience, as always, but without further ado.

October 13th:

- 12:30 a.m. – A 21 year old Milwaukeean was arrested on moon cabbage possession charges after being pulled over near the intersection of Janesville Rd. and Poes Place for speeding. Yep, still illegal in Wisconsin, guy.
- 3:15 a.m. – A 62 year old resident of the W17400 block of Janesville Rd. had a few too many, went for a walk, and got lost. Officers responded to a residence in the W17400 block of Lake Dr. (less than a mile away) after a home owner called to report the lost woman was on their front door step looking for directions. We were happy to escort her back home with the advice of calling it a night and going to bed. It happens.
- 3:27 a.m. – A 34 year old Milwaukeean was cited for OAS, a registration violation, and speeding after being pulled over near the intersection of 124th St. and North Cape Rd. Franklin P.D. was scanning our radio transmissions and stopped by after hearing the vehicle description and its striking similarities to a vehicle wanted in connection to a slew of catalytic converter thefts within their city. Wouldn't ya know it, a Sawzall was located inside the backseat of the vehicle and the front seat passenger, a 27 year old Milwaukeean, was refusing to identify himself. Now, why would you do that? Oh yeah, you have 0 legal excuses to be riding around the suburbs at 3 in the morning, smelling like oil, with a Sawzall in the backseat. That's fine, we have a fingerprint scanner for that. - 8:50 a.m. – A 52 year old Milwaukeean was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license and the company who owned the vehicle he was driving was cited for the vehicle's invalid registration status. The stop occurred near the intersection of North Cape Rd. and Boxhorn Dr.
- 9:12 a.m. – A 57 year old Muskego resident called the police department to report receiving harassing phone calls from a subject she had conducted a home appraisal for who was complaining that her assessment was the cause of a small child being injured. An officer was summoned and the number was eventually blocked.
- 11:03 a.m. – A 72 year old resident of the S6300 block of Regency Ct. called the police department out of concern for his neighbor after not seeing him for several days and the neighbor's truck not moving from its parked position during that time. An officer responded to the residence and made contact with the 78 year old neighbor who had been home sick and had not heard our complainant's knocks on his door due to his music playing in the background. Good neighbors are a blessing.
- 12:11 p.m. – A 76 year old resident of the W13300 block of Fennimore Ct. called the police department to report although legally parked, his neighbor's pickup had been sitting in the roadway for several weeks and he was concerned it would not be moved in time for the beginning of winter parking restrictions (12/1 through 4/1). They got some time yet. An officer responded to the residence associated with the truck's license plate on Fennimore Lane and spoke with the mother of the registered owner, who informed the officer that the truck was for sale and her son had moved it there to be more visible. Sounds good, however due to the registration of the truck being expired, he's required to move it off the roadway, so his mother was informed as such. Our complainant was advised. Crisis averted.

- 12:21 p.m. – A 65 year old resident of the S7100 block of Meadow Dr. called the police department to report unknown suspects were attempting to open lines of credit utilizing his personal information. A detective was summoned and determined that they were attempts only and no accounts had actually been opened. Our complainant was advised to continue monitoring his statements and provided tips on how to better safeguard his identity.
- 3:40 p.m. – A 42 year old Muskego resident responded to the police department to report the father of her child had picked up said child from school, which was against their court ordered agreement. Contact was made with dad, a 43 year old Milwaukeean, who refused to meet with mom. Unfortunately, this is a civil matter, so there's not much we can do other than document the occurrence for future court hearings.
- 4:36 p.m. – A 51 year old Waterford resident called the police department to report his elderly father who resides in Muskego had fallen victim to a scam and had dropped off a package containing a large sum of money at the UPS store in Elm Grove. We contacted Elm Grove P.D. who scurried over to the UPS store and was luckily able to receive such package. Our complainant took it upon himself to educate his father on the danger of these jerks and their devious ways. Well done son!
- 5:37 p.m. – A 21 year old Slinger resident left their wallet in the parking lot of a business located in the S7500 block of Lannon Drive. Unfortunately, they didn't respond to our phone calls until a day later, so they had to drive all the way back to Muskego. Still better than never getting it back.
- 8:09 p.m. – Officers responded to a residence located in the W15400 block of Foxtail Circle for the report of a domestic altercation. Upon arrival, contact was made with the 36 year old complainant who advised officers that the male party had since left the residence. The altercation was deemed verbal in nature. Phone contact was made with the male party to ensure his well-being. Parties were advised to remain separated and the incident was documented for informational purposes only.

October 14th:

- 4:57 a.m. – A 51 year old resident of the S6600 block of Jewel Crest Dr. was pulled over for speeding on Hillendale Dr., which he shouldn't have been on anyway as it was still closed to through traffic at the time. He was reportedly on his way to the gym, so there were definitely other routes available. Well, now instead of gettin' swol, you're gettin' cited.
- 7:38 a.m. – A U/I passerby called the police department to report a drop deck semi-tractor was parked facing south in the northbound lanes of Durham Dr. south of Woods Rd. impeding traffic and there were no flaggers present. An officer responded and located the operator who worked for a grading business out of Burlington. The vehicle was relocated to McShane Dr., parked facing the correct direction, and marked with traffic cones. Phew!
- 10:23 a.m. – A couple dogs belonging to a 64 year old resident of the W16400 block of Woods Rd. with whom we've had issues in the past were at it again. This time a resident on Ruth Lane observed the canines charge at a few nearby construction workers. An officer responded, spoke with the workers, and confirmed the story. Our dog owner was cited, once again for the "*dog at large*" violations. Municipal Ordinance § 140-1 (E)
- 10:41 a.m. – A 69 year old resident of the S6800 block of Adrian Dr. called the police department to report one of his neighbors was running a construction or landscaping business out of their home and continually parking vehicles and equipment on the roadway. An officer responded to assess and located a skid steer atop a gooseneck trailer parked on Adrian Dr. as our caller had stated. The complainant was advised to work with his HOA reference the parking restrictions they should choose or choose not to have enforced as well as to contact his alderman/woman reference the commercial business being run from a residential address.
- 10:56 a.m. – A 19 year old Milwaukeean was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license after being pulled over near the intersection of Martin Dr. and Copper Oaks Dr. after failing to yield, for which he was also cited, then advised not to drive.
- 12:43 p.m. – A 35 year old Muskego resident called the police department requesting an officer be present while she remove her belongings from the soon-to-be ex's residence on Cornell Circle. We were happy to oblige.

- 3:33 p.m. – A U/I passerby called the police department to report a female subject sitting at a picnic table at Sand Hill Park who appeared to be mixing containers of liquid, which our caller felt was suspicious and worth an officer looking into. So, we did. It's witchcraft! Just kidding. Contact was made with a 58 year old Oak Creek resident who was neither drinking nor brewing, but rather mixing her horse's medications as she was associated with the nearby farm. I've heard of horse pills, but not horse cocktails.
- 5:01 p.m. – A 47 year old Muskego resident responded to the police department to report receiving harassing messages from a 48 year old Janesville resident. An officer was summoned, and investigation revealed our complainant had been chatting with the "suspect" via a dating website and became concerned when the "suspect" claimed to know where our complainant lived, which in and of itself is not a crime. We left the other party a voicemail anyway, letting him know he was to desist contact with the complainant or else and an extra patrol of her residence was created. Ahhh, the joys of e-dating.
- 8:25 p.m. – Officers responded to a health care facility located in the W18600 block of Janesville Rd. after reports of a combative resident were received. Upon arrival, contact was made with the 57 year old suspect and the 42 year old care provider. Investigations revealed things got physical when the care provider began removing the resident's alcoholic beverages (which aren't allowed on the premises) from his room. The care provider was reassigned new patients/residents and the facility will be taking the appropriate precautionary measures to avoid similar occurrences.

October 15th:

- 12:00 a.m. – A 17 year old Muskego resident was cited for possessing a vaping device after being pulled over for speeding and equipment violations. Momma always said nothing good happened after midnight.
- 11:42 a.m. – A 30 year old Muskego resident called the police department to report receiving text messages of a harassing nature from a 29 year old Wind Lake resident, with whom we've had numerous contacts for a plethora of reasons. Our complainant was advised to block the number and offered instruction on how to obtain a restraining order.
- 1:10 p.m. – An 18 year old from Grand Blanc, MI called the police department to report her rental vehicle had been stolen from the lot of a business located in the S6500 block of Moorland Rd. as it was left there following her arrest the week prior. She was encouraged to actually look for the vehicle first as she had not already done so. Further investigation revealed the vehicle had in fact been removed by her, let's call them, "associates" from the parking lot of the same store in a neighboring city where it had been left. The rental company would later call us on the 19th to confirm its return. I might advise the rental company to desist from renting to this group.
- 1:44 p.m. – Officers responded back over to a health care facility located in the W18600 block due to the aforementioned individual who had previously been combative with staff reference the disposal of his booze now being extremely intoxicated, which is again, against facility rules. Must have had a secret stash hidden somewhere. Reports of the subject carrying a statue and requesting that other residents hit him were also received. He was ultimately taken into protective custody and transported to a different facility.
- 3:40 p.m. – Officers responded to a residence located in the S10500 block of North Shore Drive after receiving reports from the 54 year old homeowner that his daughter, who had recently been released from jail, was using controlled substances inside the residence and he wished to have her removed. Medical assistance was not initially requested, however life saving measures were later administered for overdose related complications. The victim/suspect was taken to a local hospital for treatment while in custody for a probation violation hold and possession of the controlled substance. Once medically cleared, she was transported to WCJ.
- 3:41 p.m. – A 12 year old Muskego resident called the police department to report believing he was being kidnapped by his bus driver, as he was apparently not dropped off in the usual order, was the last one on the bus, and did not recognize the route the driver was taking. His school resource officer was notified and the bus driver was subsequently contacted. Investigation revealed the driver was waiting to drop off our kidnap-ee last in order to talk to the yoot's parents reference a separate incident he had been involved in while on said bus. No further issues.

- 3:59 p.m. – You'd think a parking lot would be a safe place to practice driving with your teen. Apparently not. A 43 year old Racine resident called the police department to report her 15 year old daughter had struck a place of worship located in the W20700 block of Janesville Rd. while practicing. An area tow company was contacted and removed the vehicle. I don't believe this particular denomination practices confession in the traditional sense, but can you imagine that conversation? Might need to recite a few extra Hail Mary's and Our Father's. Carrie Underwood's *Jesus Take the Wheel* came to mind as I was typing.
- 6:13 p.m. – A 61 year old resident of the S7500 block of Kingston Dr. called the police department to report her 62 year old neighbor, with whom she has an on-going property line dispute, was outside cutting what she believed to be was HER grass (insert gasp here). An officer responded to assess and hopefully mediate the situation. Contact was made with both parties who were advised that this was a civil matter and to therefore handle said matter civilly. October 16th:

- 2:25 a.m. – A 50 year old resident of the S7200 block of Parkland Dr. was arrested for OWI, her second 1st Offense, after being pulled over in the S8500 block of Bendingbrae Dr. She was transported back to the police department, booked, and later released to I'm guessing is her 19 year old son. Classy.
- 8:04 a.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. paramedics responded to the intersection of Woods Rd. and Tess Corners Dr. for the report of a two vehicle accident that shut down lanes for a time. There was a lack of details in this CAD entry, so I'm guessing we were dabbling in something we shouldn't be dabbling in, but that is purely speculation based off prior reported incidents of a similar nature. He was counseled and advised to close/block his accounts.
- 12:21 p.m. – Wires were reportedly sparking from a line running behind a residence in the S8100 block of Pasadena Dr. inside the County Park. Officers and T.C.F.D. responded to secure the scene until We Energies arrived.

- 5:23 p.m. – Officers responded to a residence located in the W13400 block of Stonebridge Way for the report of a domestic altercation between two male subjects. Upon arrival, contact was made with the 19 year old caller and his 55 year old step-father, both of whom were arrested for the roles they played. It usually takes two. Both were transported to the department and processed. Our caller posted his own bond and was later released. The step-father was later transported to WCJ due to the nature of his charges, one being strangulation.
- 7:56 p.m. – A “big boom” was reportedly heard by a 60 year old resident of the S6900 block of Southern Dr. after it apparently, “shook the whole house”. An officer responded, however the boom was not located and no further complaints were received.
- 10:41 p.m. – A 62 year old resident of the S8300 block of Providence Way called the police department to report being duped by a scammer to the tune of \$800. Always rough, but could’ve been worse. An officer was summoned. Investigation continuing.

October 17th:

- 12:58 a.m. – A 30 year old Milwaukeean was arrested for OWI – 1st Offense following a traffic stop that occurred near the intersection of STH 36 and Loomis Dr. He was transported to the department, booked, and later released to a sober party.
- 1:06 a.m. – A U/I complainant called to report underage drinking occurring at an establishment located in the W12500 block of Loomis Ct. An officer responded and located the suspected party, 4/5 of which were of legal drinking age, however the 20 year old from Franksville had his fake ID confiscated and was politely advised to get out.

- 6:06 a.m. – A 45 year old Wind Lake resident was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a driver’s license after being pulled over for a speeding violation near the intersection of STH 36 and US 45. He was advised not to drive.
- 9:22 a.m. – A 45 year old resident of the W15300 block of Knollwood Ct. called the police department to report there was a grill in the roadway in front of his residence. Throw on some brats and give us a call when they’re done. Just kidding. An officer responded, the Department of Public Works was advised, and the grill was removed.

Our caller was concerned that his vehicle would be hit as there was no where else to park. An officer was summoned, encouraged our caller to simply park in another visitor’s stall, then advised him on the proper usage of 9-1-1.
- 5:06 p.m. – Officers and T.C.F.D. responded to the intersection of Janesville Rd. and Moorland Rd. for the report of a two vehicle accident. Multiple lanes of traffic were temporarily shut down and the county highway department was contacted due to damaged traffic control equipment. A tow was contacted to remove both vehicles. One subject was transported to an area hospital for non-life threatening injuries. A 16 year old Wind Lake resident was cited for violating a red traffic control signal and a crash report was completed.

- 6:57 p.m. – A senior living facility located in the W13700 block of Janesville Rd. called the police department requesting assistance in removing two part-time employees from the premises after their behavior had become disorderly and they were refusing to leave. Upon arrival, contact was made with an 18 year old Tosa resident and an 18 year old from Hales Corners, who for all intensive purposes, probably could have walked home. Both ladies were advised of the complaint at which time they agreed to wait quietly outside for their rides. Time to start acting like adults, girls.

Officers responded and located the suspect, a 67 year old Milwaukeean. We had to let the 67 year old go, but we were able to identify the other two. Investigation continuing.
- 8:05 p.m. – 3 yoots and their parents were advised of trespassing on a vacated property in the W21600 block of Janesville Rd. Parents were already present, just not paying very close attention to their yoots, which often leads to these types of incidents.
- 8:25 p.m. – A U/I complainant called the police department to report being threatened by a 45 year old Jefferson resident in the parking lot of a business located in the W13500 block of Janesville Rd. A third party connected to our suspect had intervened, however our caller was now concerned for the 3rd party due to the suspect's behavior. Contact was made with the 3rd party, a 38 year old Muskego resident who advised there was no cause for concern. Our suspect was advised reference his behavior.
- 11:22 p.m. – A 36 year old Milwaukeean and a 34 year old Greendale resident were pulled over near the intersection of Pioneer Dr. and Janesville Rd. due to the registration for the vehicle indicating that the registered owner's driver's license was revoked, however neither of them were in fact the owner, BUT the Milwaukeean was under the influence (3rd Offense) and the passenger from Greendale did have some paraphernalia on her person, so they were both arrested anyway. Miss Greendale was cited, booked, and released. The Milwaukeean spent the night at WCJ.

October 18th:

- 6:57 a.m. – Bambi is wanted in connection with yet another hit and run. This time he ran into a white Nissan before taking off on hoof. Contact was made with the 28 year old vehicle operator from New Berlin who was uninjured. Crash report completed.
- 7:37 a.m. – Officers Obi and Sirius responded to the high school for there regular sniff through of the campus.
- 7:48 a.m. – A 45 year old resident of the W20700 block of Heather Ln. woke up to find her neighbor's outdoor fire still smoldering and was concerned it would reignite while unattended. An officer responded and determined that this was not possible, but notified the home owner of our caller's concern none the less.
- 10:05 a.m. – A 24 year old resident of the S7600 block of Independence Dr. called the police department seeking assistance in removing what she deemed to be a sickly skunk taking up residence in her backyard. Love responding to these calls. Upon the officer's arrival, Pepé was located inside a nearby storage shed, breathing his last few breaths. Our complainant was advised to simply let him pass, then dispose of his carcass as opposed to us shooting him, as skunks tend to spray upon trauma. Might be speaking from experience. Thankfully, she took our advice.
- 12:50 p.m. – A 39 year old former resident of Muskego was called in as an intoxicated pedestrian inside a business located in the W16700 block of Janesville Rd. The second such call received within the past month. An officer responded and transported him to a shelter in Waukesha.
- 1:00 p.m. – A 62 year old resident of the S8300 block of Providence Way responded to the police department to report being the victim of a fraudulent transaction via Facebook Marketplace. An officer was summoned, investigation continuing.
- 3:28 p.m. – A U/I complainant called the police department to report their neighbor in the S6300 block of Tess Corners Dr. was blowing their grass clippings into the roadway, which our caller felt was a hazard to motorcyclists. Potentially. An officer responded, advised the felonious grass clipping blower of their fault, after which they cleared the roadway of all aforementioned grass clippings.

- 3:53 p.m. – An employee of a business located in the W16800 block of Janesville Rd. called 9-1-1 to report receiving a phone call from a male subject that demanded all employees exit the business, cash in hand, and that he was waiting outside the business with a gun. Yeah, sure. Officers responded, however nothing of suspicion was located. Further investigation revealed the scam had occurred at several other locations for the same business in the Milwaukee metro area.
- 4:12 p.m. – A 32 year old resident of the S8200 block of Pioneer Dr. called the police department to report her laptop had been stolen by a 31 year old Lake Geneva resident. An officer was summoned. Investigation revealed the laptop was in fact not stolen, but rather had been lent to the Lake Geneva resident who was holding onto the laptop until it was determined whether or not the Sheriff's Department would need it in relation to a death investigation. Our original complainant was advised. Moving on.
- 4:34 p.m. – A 24 year old resident of the W12800 block of Acker Dr. responded to the police department to report an unknown subject had hacked her Facebook account and subsequently purchased several items from Marketplace using her information. An officer was summoned. Our complainant advised her banking institution would be refunding any of the fraudulent purchases and as no credible leads for the suspect were located, the thefts were reported for informational purposes only.
- 6:05 p.m. – A 51 year old resident of the S7400 block of Michi Dr. called the police department to report her Halloween decorations had been destroyed and she was pointing a guilty finger at her 62 year old neighbor. An officer responded and spoke with the neighbor who denied all allegations, so the damage report was kept for informational purposes should something similar occur in the future.
- 10:29 p.m. – A 57 year old resident of the S7100 block of Hillside Dr. was arrested for OWI – 1st Offense after being pulled over near the intersection of Hillendale Dr. and Lembezeder Dr. His 23 year old son who was in the vehicle with him was given a ride home, and after he was booked, he was released to his 24 year old daughter.

October 19th:

- 1:30 a.m. – A 35 year old Oak Creek resident was also arrested for OWI – 1st Offense after an employee of a business located in the W13500 block of Janesville Rd. called the police department to report the intoxicated patron had just left the store westbound. He was eventually located and pulled over on Janesville Rd. near Ancient Oaks Dr. You know the rest.
- 5:47 a.m. – A 56 year old Burlington resident called the police department to report hitting a deer near the intersection of STH 36 and US 45. Our caller was uninjured and the deer was no longer on scene. An officer responded and a crash report was completed.
- 9:35 a.m. – D.P.W. employees called the police department to report multiple overweight vehicles traveling on Muskego Dam Dr. An officer responded and caught up to the three trucks on Highway 164 between Kelsey Dr. and Henneberry Dr. All three operators were driving for the same Germantown based company. All three vehicles were cited for the violations, which I'm told exceeded \$30K total. Ouch.
- 10:03 a.m. – A 55 year old resident of the W18500 block of Janesville Rd. called the police department to report her 29 year old son had stolen her vehicle within the last ten minutes and left in an unknown direction. While dispatchers were disseminating information to responding officers, one of our detectives was traveling south on Racine Ave. in New Berlin, and happened to pass the vehicle. New Berlin P.D. was contacted, a traffic stop was performed, and the now former resident of mom's house was cited for operating without owner's consent. He was provided a ride back to mom's to retrieve his belongings and mom was given a lift to retrieve her vehicle.
