March 18th, 2022 – March 24th, 2022

Good afternoon my fellow Muskegoans! We had sunshine for all of a few hours this morning before the cloud cover made its return. I hope this edition of the newsletter finds you enjoying your Friday none the less. Tomorrow marks National *Live Long and Prosper* Day which is not what I will be writing inside my wife's 30th birthday card, but here's to all you Vulcans out there and here's to my wife! Happy Birthday!

March 18th:

- 12:22 a.m. – Officers responded to an establishment located in the W16300 block of Woods Rd. after an employee called to report an “irate customer” standing in the parking lot following said establishment's closure for the evening. Officers responded and located the patron, later identified as a 34 year old Butler resident. She eventually calmed down and was subsequently transported to her former address inside the city where she was allowed to stay with the new home owner. That was nice of them.
- 1:32 a.m. – A 42 year old male subject...♪ from Boston ♪, was arrested for OWI – 1st Offense after being pulled over near the intersection of Tess Corners Dr. and Woods Rd. I guess someone didn't enjoy responsibly. Should've listened to their cousin. He was transported to the police department, booked, then transported to a residence on Kipling Dr. and released to a sober party.
- 2:03 a.m. – Got another one, this time from Wind Lake. A 22 year old male subject was arrested for OWI – 1st Offense after being pulled over near the intersection of Loomis Dr. and Champions Dr. He too was transported to the department, booked, and later released to his mother.
