Notable Calls

January 3rd

6:04 AM :: Officers conducted a traffic stop on the east end of the city leading to an arrest for possession of a controlled substance (both municipal and felony levels), possession of drug paraphernalia, and operating after suspension. The officer also issued correctional notices for an equipment violation and no insurance. Now that's a way to start off an early morning shift!

6:25 PM :: An anonymous caller reported that there was a disabled vehicle on the south end of the city. While an officer was en route, the subject from the seemingly disabled vehicle called and advised she felt like "everyone was watching her" and she was "confused". While, when officers got on the scene, the subject was taken into custody for OWI - 4th offense, possession of drug paraphernalia, and possession of open intoxicants.

January 5th

10:06 PM :: On the east end of our city, a subject called to report his ex-wife was threatening him with a knife. No one was injured, but the ex-wife was arrested for domestic violence - battery.

January 7th

4:03 AM :: On the south end of our city, an officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle they observed traveling 16 mph in a 40 mph zone and swerving. After turning on the cherries and berries, the vehicle continued almost a mile. Before pulling over and throwing the keys out of the window without prompting, the operator was actually waving his hands out of his window letting the officer know he saw them and was going to pull over. Now I am not a detective, but I think we can all agree that's a clue 🤔. That same operator was arrested for eluding, bail jumping, and operating after revocation.

January 9th

12:09 PM :: Again on the south side of the city, a dayshift sergeant located a vehicle that was reported stolen through the City of Milwaukee. A high-risk traffic stop was conducted and subjects were taken into custody. A search of the vehicle also led to charges of possession of drug paraphernalia.

January 12th

1:17 PM :: A caller on the east side of our city reported that her vehicle had caught fire while in the driveway. Luckily, she was quick-witted and was able to extinguish the flames prior to PD and FD arrival.

January 13th

8:18 AM :: An officer conducted a traffic stop on the south end of our city which led to an arrest for felony bail jumping and operation after revocation.

January 14th

12:51 AM :: A late shift officer stopped out to check on some occupied vehicles at a closed business in the south end of our city. One of the occupants turned out to have a warrant from the Waukesha County Sheriff's Office. The subject was taken into custody and a bond was posted. And this is why we hang out at home and not closed businesses at 1 o'clock in the morning.

11:45 PM :: A late shift officer stopped a vehicle on the south end of our city. After contact, the Officer suspected the driver of operating while intoxicated. After some standardized field sobriety tests, the subject was taken into custody for OWI - 1st Offense. Further testing proved the subject was a .12.

January 15th

11:21 PM :: Late shift officers were requested to help the Waukesha County Sheriff's Office with a domestic violence call that was in Big Bend. It was reported that the male suspect had a gun to the head of a female victim. With good teamwork and tactics, the situation was able to be resolved peacefully. Great job night shift!

January 18th

6:32 PM :: A 911 caller reported a possibly intoxicated driver in the northern part of our city. First clue...the operator and their vehicle were in the ditch and the operator was laying on the ground, smelling of "adult beverages". Ultimately, EMS responded to ensure the subject was not injured, and officers determined probable cause for OWI - 1st Offense. The subject was processed and released accordingly.

January 20th

12:06 PM :: 911 Caller reported that their vehicle was struck by a red truck near Racine Ave / Hillendale Dr. Two more callers reported that the same suspect truck was operating recklessly, that they observed the first crash, and that the truck was leaving Muskego on I-43. Through some teamwork with New Berlin PD and the Waukesha County Sheriff's Office the vehicle was located crashed near the east county line the subject was taken into custody for Hit-And-Run w/ Occupied Vehicle, OWI - 2nd Offense, Operating while revoked, and two counts of bail jumping.

January 26th

11:25 PM :: A 911 call came in initially as an open line with nothing heard. Upon callback, the user of the phone immediately hung up on dispatch. After another callback, dispatch was able to make contact with a male who sounded intoxicated and a female in the background who sounded like she may be in distress. Officers were sent and an investigation of the incident resulted in the arrest of the male for DV-Battery. Great job dispatch!

January 29th

2:40 AM :: A late shift sergeant located a vehicle in the ditch with its lights on the northern part of Racine Ave. When the sergeant turned around to investigate, the lights on the vehicle were off and there were footprints from the vehicle to a nearby residence...ironically the registered owner's address... Officers investigated and placed the operator under arrest for OWI - 3rd Offense. I guess snow may actually be good for something after all.

January 30th

9:43 AM :: A dayshift sergeant located a vehicle that was towing a trailer that was reported stolen through the Everest Metro Police Department. A traffic stop was conducted and the operator was taken into custody for possession of the stolen property.
